Annual Meeting and Program

With Hallie E. Bond, author of

“Boats & Boating in the Adirondacks”

Ever since Ralph Waldo Emerson took a trip through the Adirondacks in a small boat, millions of Americans have seen an Adirondack vacation as the antidote to the stress and pollution of industrialized society. This illustrated lecture explores boatshops, liveries, and a way of life and leisure that has all but vanished. The rich heritage of Adirondack small boats ranges from canoes of birchbark and cedar to sailing yachts; from humble fishing skiffs to motorboats powered by electricity or aircraft engines; and, the legendary Adirondack guideboat, called the finest traditional rowboat on the continent. A century ago, the region was "that Venice of the woods, whose Highways are rivers, whose paths are streams, and whose carriages are boats." Today, most travelers see the Adirondacks from the seat of a car. We have gained easy access to "the East's last great wilderness;" by re-discovering the small boat heritage of the Adirondacks, we explore what may have been lost along the way.

This program, which is free and open to the public, is made possible through the support of the New York Council for the Humanities' "Speakers in the Humanities" program.



Budget & Trustee Election **Tues May 20: noon – 8 pm**

The Northville Public Library Board of Trustees has worked to develop a responsible budget with the least impact on our local taxpayers.

The 2014-2015 budget increases expenditures by \$2452. The increase is due to higher heating and electric costs and a rise in workers' compensation. Salaries have been frozen to achieve this goal.

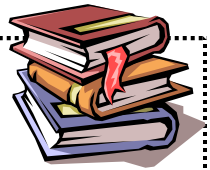
Library services include: books, dvds, audiobooks, e-content, computer/WiFi use, local history collection, programs + much more.

E- Content

The library provides access to free downloads of E-books and E-audiobooks. Patrons with valid library cards may enter the “Overdrive” site through our website link and search for titles for downloading to their devices (Kindles, Nooks, Smartphones, Ipods, etc). Four titles may be borrowed at one time. E-Books are loaned for one to three weeks, E-Audios for one or two weeks. If a title is out, a patron may place a request for a title and join the queue. An email will be sent when the title is available for downloading. Also, the library owns a Nook which is available for a two week loan. It is loaded with many titles.
